Apostle Islands 2014: Stockton Island

In June, a group of eight ISK members took a trip that was meant to introduce newer paddlers to a more challenging trip on Lake Superior involving several crossings. The trip was to use Stockton Island as a base camp for exploring Michigan Island and any other destination the group wanted to.
